

THE SUMMER ASSIGNMENT FOR AP EUROPEAN HISTORY, 2016-17

Part I: Map Exercises

- Be able to label a political map of Europe (nations and capitals)
- Be able to locate and label all islands, bodies of water, major mountain ranges, and peninsulas.
- Be able to identify/outline all the major regions of Europe and know the significance of each region/territory.

Part II: Reading Assignment

- Read chapters 29, 30, and 31. You will be given a multiple choice exam on these chapters **on the first day of school.**
- Submit a definition and significance for all the **Key Terms** located at the end of each chapter. This part of the assignment should be handwritten only in dark blue or black ink. **It is due on the first day of school.**

Part III: The Document Based Question

- Complete DBQ 14, pp. A35-37. This essay should be no greater than three pages in length, double-spaced in 12 pt. TNR. **A hard copy is due on the first day of class.**
- Before you begin this assignment, familiarize yourself with the three-step process recommended by the College Entrance Examination Board located on p. A-2. Also, pay close attention to the pages in the packet having to do with style, usage, and passive voice.
- You will be required to submit an electronic copy of this assignment to *Turn It In*. You will be given the class code and password for this assignment on the first day of class.

Students must stop by the M-A Library and collect a 3-part packet and a textbook in order to complete the Summer Assignment.

Please take note of the fact that there is a practice regions test included in this packet. The numbered regions on the map do NOT correspond to the numbered regions on the sheets providing you with a definition/description and significance for the region. The map is a practice test .
